*Supervisor Kondylis and Supervisor Seifert expressed their concern that deletion of six of the listed positions had little or no impact to the County's General Fund should not be eliminated.*

*Assistant County Administrator Nancy Huston noted that the positions listed had been vacant for a period of time and that a process was being undertaken to identify savings to the General Fund. Ms. Huston further noted that automation programs were being implemented which would reduce the need for Office Assistant positions.*

*Director of Health and Social Services Patrick Duterte, noted that they were streamlining their processes by pooling resources and reducing their footprint due to shrinking General Fund dollars and reductions in state and federal dollars.*

*Donald Tipton, unincorporated Vallejo, noted that he felt that the savings should be made clearer.*

*Tracee Stacey, In-Home Supportive Services, supported the keeping of positions until no longer funded by the state and federal government.*

*The Board received an update on the status of the Delta planning process and initiatives currently underway, including the Delta Stewardship Councils Delta Plan; the Delta Protection Commissions Economic Sustainability Plan; and the Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP). The Board was requested to consider authorizing staff to prepare a memorandum for the Board Chairman's signature to the U.S. Department of the Interior and the California Department of Water Resources setting forth the County's comments and concerns regarding the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the State Water Contractors.*

*Director of Resource Management Bill Emlen informed the Board that there was a proposed Memorandum of Agreement between the State Water Contractors, the Department of Interior, and the State Department of Water Resources. Mr. Emlen noted that the Delta Counties Coalition congressional delegation took a proactive and aggressive action in terms of raising the issue regarding the manner in which the Bay Delta Conservation Planning process was unfolding and the nature of the Memorandum of Agreement. Mr. Emlen noted that the 2009 State Water legislation package involved many initiatives and planning activities which were coming to fruition and that the review and comment periods were short. Mr. Emlen noted that they would be requesting an additional 120 day review period to provide more time to provide an adequate review. Mr. Emlen noted that they would continue to argue for a greater involvement of local governmental entities and communities in the process.*

*Dan Wolk, County Counsel's Office, noted that one of the major processes besides the Delta Plan was the Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) which was being developed pursuant to the federal Endangered Species Act and the State Natural Communities Conservation Planning Act with the goal of providing a reliable source of water from the Delta to communities south of the Delta while at the same time restoring habitat in the Delta to provide protection to endangered species. Mr. Wolk noted that, in the past, the County was critical of the BDCP process for excluding the Delta communities from fully participating in the process. Mr. Wolk noted that the Memorandum of Agreement was a joint planning document between the state and federal agencies that were developing the Plan and the State Water Contractors while excluding the Delta counties from their participation. Mr. Wolk noted that the process was flawed which in turn resulted in a Memorandum of Agreement that was one sided and it was their hope that with enough comments, the federal government would have what they needed to withdraw their support.*

*Mr. Emlen noted that the the Memorandum of Agreement would provide economic development to one part of the state at the expense of the other part of the state. In addition, it was still being determined who would pay for the cost of the plan.*

*June Guidotti, unincorporated Suisun, noted her objection to the Bay Delta Conservation Plan and her objection to Potrero Hills Landfill using Delta water to water garbage.*

*George Guynn, Jr., Suisun, noted his support for dividing California in two parts and having Southern California buy the water from Northern California.*

*In response to a concern expressed by George Guynn, Jr., Suisun, it was noted that the loans would be from a private company and that there would be no legal liability to the County.*

*In response to a concern expressed by Supervisor Kondylis, representatives from Caritas Acquisitions I, LLC noted that this was an Affordable Housing Project and rent increases would be tied to the Area Medium Income (AMI) and not improvements.*

*The Board held a public hearing to consider adopting: A) Resolution approving and adopting a Negative Declaration for the first amendment to the 1995 Countywide Siting Element of the Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan and B) Resolution approving and adopting the First Amendment to the 1995 Countywide Siting Element of the Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan and was requested to direct staff to implement an annual disposal capacity reporting requirement and direct staff to seek approval of the amendment by the cities within the County and by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle).*

*Narcissa Untal, Department of Resource Management, noted that they were tasked with the responsibility of maintaining, administering, and implementing the countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan as required under the Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989. Ms. Untal reviewed the requirements of the Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 requiring all jurisdictions to divert 50% of their baseline year (1998) landfill waste each year. Ms. Untal reported that each city reported separately to the State and that, if any one of the jurisdictions failed to comply with that mandate, they were then individually subject to a fine of up to \$10,000 per day. Ms. Untal noted that the Act also established a process to ensure environmentally safe disposal of any discards. Ms. Untal reported that in 2007, legislation was adopted which changed the manner in which the diversion rate was calculated and created a uniform baseline for every jurisdiction.*

*Harry Englebright, Consultant, reported that the basic requirement of the Siting Element was to demonstrate that the County had sufficient capacity to accommodate the waste generated within Solano County within the County's existing landfills. If not, the County would be required to implement a program to secure that capacity. Mr. Englebright reviewed the County's 15-Year Disposal Capacity. Mr. Englebright reviewed the proposed Footnote for Line 2f of Table 4.1 (Recology Hay Road) and Table 4.2 (Potrero Hills Landfill) calculating the remaining Site Life Estimates.*

*Ms. Untal noted that a requirement of the Siting Element was to demonstrate that the County could manage 15 years of the projected disposal expected to generate and that the County could manage those discards in County. If not, the County would be required to identify export strategies to manage those waste. Ms. Untal further noted that the County was required to identify any solid waste facility that was subject to a solid waste facility permit. Ms. Untal noted that the proposed amendment to the Siting Element included updated information of the existing two landfills that accepted municipal solid waste (Potrero Hills Landfill and Recology) and the addition of the Tonnesen Pet Cemetery (a non-municipal solid waste facility) which has been in existence since the 1980s and was now subject to obtaining a solid waste facility permit as a direct result of the Regional Water Quality Control Board change in their designation. In addition, the amendment included the deletion of two facilities which were the Rio Vista Landfill due to its closure and Aqua Clear Farms which was a drilling mud disposal site located in unincorporated Solano County.*

*Chair Reagan opened the hearing to the public.*

*David Tam, SPRAWLDEF, noted that there was adequate landfill space in Solano County for the next 15 years and that the implementation of adequate tipping fees would slow the importation of garbage to the Potrero Hills Landfill.*

*June Guidotti, unincorporated Suisun, noted that she felt that the documents presented were inaccurate.*

*George Guynn, Jr., Suisun, noted that the people voted for Measure E regarding the importation of garbage and felt that it should be enforced.*

*Jill Firch, CalRECYCLE, noted that the County, in the Amendment of the Siting Element, had legally met the requirement to show 15 year disposal within the County between the Potrero Hills Landfill and Recology Hay Road.*

*Donald Tipton, unincorporated Vallejo, noted that he felt that the County should uphold the intent of Measure E.*

*James Dunbar, Potrero Hills Landfill and Chair of the Integrated Management Task Force, expressed support of the Integrated Waste Management Plan.*

*As there was no one further who wished to speak on this matter, Chair Reagan closed the public hearing.*

*In response to a concern expressed by Supervisor Seifert, Mr. Englebright noted that it was requested that a footnote be added to Table 4.1 and Table 4.2 of the Siting Element explaining the formula and calculation used determining the remainder of landfill life in each of the landfills.*

*Supervisor Kondylis noted that she opposed the expansion of the Potrero Hills Landfill and did not feel that the Environmental Impact Report was adequate for that expansion. Supervisor Kondylis noted that she felt that the methods used in the disposal of solid waste were out of date and that more effort should be made toward recycling.*

*At the conclusion of discussion, the Board took the following action:*

*Supervisor Spering noted that he felt that a stipend should be included for conference calls.*

*Director of Health and Social Services Patrick Duterte noted that the budget for the Public Authority had been reduced from \$52,000 to \$6,000 and that that the Advisory Committee expressed their support for maintaining their stipend of \$100 for a reduced number of meetings and that minutes would be provided by the Advisory Committee. In addition, funding for conferences and trainings would be limited; the Public Authority newsletter would be eliminated; and the IHSS Public Authority page on the County website would be completed to replace the newsletter.*

*Kathy Mitsopoulos and Tracee Stacy, In-Home Supportive Services Public Authority*

*Advisory Committee members, noted that their input was requested in restructuring their budget and due to the need for get information to the public, they were willing to conduct additional meetings by conference calls in order to manage the reduced budget. In addition, they had proposed a reduced stipend in order to retain other items in their budget.*

## **BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS AND REPORTS ON MEETINGS**

*Chair Reagan invited members of the Board to make comments and reports on meetings. The following comments were received:*

*B. Supervisor Kondylis commented on a Letter to the Editor suggesting that Solano County go to a daylight savings time on a continuous basis.*

*C. Supervisor Spering requested staff to continue working with Mission Solano to assist them in their needs.*

*Assistant County Administrator Nancy Huston noted that a meeting had been set which was canceled by Mission Solano and that they would continue to work to reschedule another meeting.*
