B. George Guynn, Jr., Suisun City, noted that he felt that more items should be placed on the Regular Agenda for discussion. Mr. Guynn noted that he did not support the Solano360 project and felt that there should be more public participation in this matter.

A. Donald Tipton, unincorporated Vallejo, expressed concern regarding the distribution of the voting results; logistics with the voting places; vacancies on the Solano County Agricultural Advisory Committee; priority of Homeacres Improvement District in the Public Works Five Year Capital Improvement Plan; and reimbursement for the cost of water for the Middle Green Valley Specific Plan.

B. George Guynn, Jr., Suisun City, noted that the permit for the Potrero Hills Landfill expansion was overturned; did not support the reduction of membership on the Agricultural Advisory Committee as he did not fee that there would be adequate representation; and that he did not support the purchase of a surveillance robot for the Benicia Police Department under the Homeland Security grant program as he felt that it would be utilized to spy on citizens and reduce freedom and liberty.

C. Steve Chappell, Executive Director of the Suisun Resource Conservation District, expressed support for the recommendations of the Solano County Parks and

Recreation Commission for award of grants from the Fish and Wildlife Propagation Fund.

Michelle Heppner, County Administrator's Office, provided the Board with the Proposed 2013 State Legislative Platform and the Proposed 2013 Federal Legislative Platform. It was noted that general legislative principles were included to enable County staff and the County's legislative advocates to respond timely to state and federal legislative proposals throughout the legislative session. In addition, it was noted that the County's 2013 Legislative Platforms would be posted to the newly created Legislative Affairs website to enable County staff and members of the public the ability to view state bills tracked by the County each legislative session and provide the status of positions taken by the County on bills tracked. Other functions available on the website will include bill search, options to find legislatures, and posted Legislative Committee agenda packets.

Supervisor Kondylis noted that she felt that proposed legislation concerning the newly formed Bay Area Restoration Authority should be included in the Federal Legislative Platform which would provide funding for the San Francisco Bay-Delta. It was the consensus of the Board that this matter be added to the County's federal legislative platform.

Supervisor Reagan requested that the State Legislative Platform pertaining to the Travis Community Consortium Platform be enhanced to encourage the State to adopt proactive measures regarding the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) and convene an office at the State level to work with each community that has a military installation or defense contractors to protect California's interest with the decline in defense spending and the probable realignment of missions and closure of bases.

Supervisor Reagan requested that the State Legislature be encouraged to work with the Governor to obtain protective posturing for the entire State. It was the consensus of the Board to add this matter to the State Legislative Platform.

Supervisor Sperring requested that there be clarification to the State Legislative Platform under General Government to note that mutually acceptable tax sharing agreements for annexation and incorporation referred to Vehicle License Fees and that under Transportation, that the threshold for voter approval for legislation that provides for the imposition, extension, or increase of a special tax be at 55 percent.

Paul Yoder, County State Legislative Advocate, informed the Board that the State deficit, through the end of the next State budget cycle, could be as low as \$2 billion. Mr. Yoder reported that as a result of the November, 2012 General Election, there will be a 2/3 majority of Democrats in both the Senate and Assembly.

Donald Tipton, unincorporated Vallejo, expressed support of the Suisun Marsh and Measure E; support for good government and requested that Napa County's Measure Z be placed on the ballot for voter approval; requested that Homeacres Redevelopment Funds that were used for overlays instead of the Road Fund be returned; and opposed fee and tax increases under Reauthorization of MAP-21.

George Guynn, Jr., Suisun City, noted that he did not support a threshold of 55 percent to approve a tax increase and felt that a 2/3 vote should be required.

In response to a concern expressed by Supervisor Kondylis, it was the consensus of the Board that the County begin to focus on carbon sequestration credits due to the number of acres in Solano County dedicated to agriculture and wetlands.

At the conclusion of discussion, it was moved by Supervisor Reagan, seconded by Supervisor Sperring, to approve Solano County's Proposed 2013 State Legislative Platform and the Proposed 2013 Federal Legislative Platform with the following modifications:

1) Proposed legislation concerning the newly formed Bay Area Restoration Authority should be included in the Federal Legislative Platform which would provide funding for the San Francisco Bay-Delta;

2) State Legislative Platform pertaining to the Travis Community Consortium Platform be enhanced to encourage the State to adopt proactive measures regarding the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) and convene an office at the State level to work with each community that has a military installation or defense contractors to protect California's interest with the decline in defense spending and the probable realignment of missions and closure of bases; and

3) Clarification to the State Legislative Platform under General Government to note that mutually acceptable tax sharing agreements for annexation and incorporation referred to Vehicle License Fees; and that under Transportation the threshold for voter approval

*for legislation that provides for the imposition, extension, or increase of a special tax
be at 55 percent.*

Ron Grassi, County Administrator's Office, noted that the Board would be provided with an update on community input regarding the establishment of a County Probation Day Reporting Center in the City of Vallejo under AB109 and that staff was requesting that the Board take action to implement the Probation Department's Post Release Community Supervision Unit.

Chris Hansen, Chief Probation Officer, noted that at the direction of the Board, a community forum was held on November 14, 2012 in Vallejo. Mr. Hansen provide the Board with information pertaining to the City of Residents for Supervised Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS) and noted that 41% of the PRCS population resided in the City of Vallejo and 34% in the City of Fairfield. Mr. Hansen noted that 56% of the PRCS population was high risk and 92% were male. Mr. Hansen reported that the goal of a Day Reporting Center would be to reduce recidivism and provide the PRCS population with the appropriate assessment and services. Mr. Hansen requested that the Board consider an additional public forum in January, 2013 to discuss the establishment of a County Probation Day Reporting Center and provide a report back to the Board on February 5, 2013. Mr. Hansen requested that the Board approve additional staffing for the Probation Department's Post Release Community Supervision Unit which would include: 1.0 FTE Limited Term Supervising Deputy

Probation Officer and 1.0 FTE Limited Term Social Worker III to the Public Defender's Office with expiration dates of June 30, 2014 and delete 0.5 FTE Limited Term Social Worker II and requested approval of an Appropriations Transfer Request of \$324,000 for staff training and salaries funded with AB109 Realignment funds.

Chair Seifert invited members of the public to address the Board on this matter and comments were received from: 1) George Guynn, Jr., Suisun City, who supported community involvement and felt that the Day Reporting Center should be located in an area that was secluded from other elements; 2) Dennis Yen, Retired State Probation Officer and resident of the City of Vallejo, who felt that any delay in opening the Day Reporting Center in the City of Vallejo would be detrimental to the community; and 3) Doug Darling, City of Vallejo, who expressed support for an additional scheduled public forum.

At the conclusion of discussion, it was moved by Supervisor Spring, seconded by Supervisor Vasquez, to take the following action:

- 1) Received a County staff update on community input regarding the establishment of a County Probation Day Report Center in the City of Vallejo under AB109, including public forum held on November 14, 2012 (continued from November 6, 2012 meeting).
- 2) Approved an additional community forum in January 2013, and continued decision regarding the Day Reporting Center related actions until February 5, 2013.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS AND REPORTS ON MEETINGS

Chair Seifert invited members of the Board to make comments and reports on meetings. The following comments were received:
