Director of Human Resources Marc Fox provided the Board with an overview of the proposed ordinance.

Chairwoman Hannigan opened the public hearing.

Auditor Controller Simona Padilla-Scholtens introduced the item.

Assistant Auditor Controller Phyllis Taynton provided the Board with an overview of the proposed Solano County Jail Access Fee for FY2015/16.

In response to a question from Supervisor Seifert, Ms. Taynton noted that the current fee was \$350.11 and that the proposed fee was based on actual data for FY2013/14.

Supervisor Thomson asked what the anticipated bookings would be in the future.

Chairwoman Hannigan commented on bookings and availability of police officers to make arrests.

Ms. Taynton noted that the Sheriff's Office had billed for 271 bookings equating to roughly \$96,000 in FY2013/14. She then advised that the data for FY2014/15 was not available yet as the fiscal year was not yet over. Lastly, she commented on the Jail Access Fee formula.

Supervisor Thomson asked if the number of bookings were increasing or decreasing.

County Administrator Birgitta Corsello noted that more information on bookings would be provided to the Board. She then commented on impacts to bookings including reclassification of felonies to misdemeanors and noted that the Jail Access Fee applied to felony bookings. She advised that there would likely be discussions at the local or state level regarding Jail Access Fees and the increase in misdemeanor bookings.

Undersheriff Gary Elliot provided the Board with information on bookings and noted that the level was tied to staffing levels at local police departments. He advised that bookings tended to increase as more officers were on the street. He then commented on the rolling average of misdemeanor bookings and the impacts of Proposition 47 on the felony bookings.

Supervisor Thomson requested that information on bookings for FY2014/15 be provided to the Board.

Supervisor Seifert commented on the bookings for FY2013/14 and asked for clarification on the number of bookings by the Sheriff's Office.

Mr. Elliot noted that transfers to and from the prison to out of county and warrant arrests out of county were included in the booking numbers.

Supervisor Seifert asked whether a fee was charged for those transfers.

Administrative Services Manager Jeff Liddicoat noted that the total number of bookings was used to calculate the average booking fee and commented on the booking fee in relation to the Government Code.

Supervisor Seifert noted that it did not make sense to include those transfers in the number of bookings if they were not charging a fee for them.

County Counsel Dennis Bunting noted that all of this was statutory and suggested that the Board's Legislative Committee look into this matter.

Supervisor Seifert commented on the number of uncompensated bookings.

Ms. Padilla-Scholtens noted that there was a booking fee for all cities that was not being charged due to state funds received for those and that this report applied to the Jail Access Fee that was based on a three year average of bookings and only applied to cities that exceeded their 3-year average.

Supervisor Spring noted that it would be helpful to separate out the unincorporated County arrests from the other bookings.

Ms. Padilla-Scholtens noted that they would work with the Sheriff's Office to make the report more transparent for the next year.

Chairwoman Hannigan closed the public hearing.

On motion of Supervisor Vasquez, seconded by Supervisor Seifert, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2015-111 imposing a Jail Access Fee for Fiscal Year 2015-16. So ordered by 5-0 vote. (see Resolution Book)

Chairwoman Hannigan opened the public hearing.

Director of General Services Mike Lango introduced the item.

Assistant Director of General Services Kanon Artiche provided the Board with an overview of the Updated Solano County 5-year Capital Facilities Improvement Plan (CIP).

Chairwoman Hannigan asked how often the building codes were published.

Mr. Artiche noted that they were published every three years.

In response to additional questions from Chairwoman Hannigan, Mr. Artiche provided information on the requirements of the code in regards to improvements to buildings and new projects.

County Administrator Birgitta Corsello also commented on requirements of the code in regards to repairs and renovations of buildings.

County Counsel Dennis Bunting noted that the County's ordinance would be updated at the same time the updated or new code came out.

Mr. Artiche continued to provide the Board with the overview of the CIP.

Chairwoman Hannigan commented on the Water Efficiency Retrofit Projects estimate.

Mr. Artiche noted that the estimate was in the process of being substantiated and provided the Board with information on current and future activities surrounding the project.

Mr. Lango noted that they had identified water management systems for the jail and that these would come back at a later date for presentation to the Board.

Chairwoman Hannigan commented on aging systems and water saving devices.

Mr. Lango commented on short and long term strategies to conserve water.

Mr. Artiche noted that water conservation efforts would be incorporated at every opportunity.

Chairwoman Hannigan requested that the water fountains be replaced with water bottle filling stations. She also asked about FY2016/17 upgrades to the video management security systems and asked if that included the Board Chamber.

Ms. Corsello noted that it did.

Supervisor Thomson commented on page B4 regarding a joint occupancy agreement and asked if there was a County maintenance requirement for the Old Courthouse.

Mr. Artiche noted that the Old Courthouse was now owned by the State and that there was not a maintenance responsibility for the County other than the war memorial on the grounds.

Supervisor Spering asked whether the percentage of water conservation was countywide or per facility.

Ms. Corsello noted that water conservation percentages were by city and commented on facility use and objectives within each community. She also advised that the percentage would be an average calculation.

Supervisor Spering commented on concerns with preserving a balance in maintaining landscape and trees. He then asked whether the Beck Avenue campus used reclaimed water.

Ms. Corsello advised that none of the County's facilities were set up to use reclaimed water at this time.

Supervisor Spering asked that staff look at opportunities to bring reclaimed water into the Beck Avenue campus.

Mr. Artiche noted that they would take this into consideration during development of the Campus Master Plan.

In response to questions and comments from Supervisor Thomson and Chairwoman Hannigan, Mr. Lango noted that the fountain in front of the County Administrative Center used recycled water. He advised that the fountain would be kept running but would have reduced hours of operation with signage indicating placed nearby to indicate that it was recycling water and to list the hours of operation. He noted that the boat fountain would be turned off to conserve water.

Ms. Corsello noted that groundskeepers were experimenting with ways to reduce water needs and keep the lawns decent for public use. She also noted that signage would be incorporated in that effort as well.

Supervisor Vasquez also commented on the fountain usage by the public.

Supervisor Seifert commented on the Vallejo Veterans Center and improvements that had been made by the veterans to the facility. She asked that staff look at ways to make sure the center was not forgotten about.

Ms. Corsello noted that they were still working on several veterans facilities and that staff would look into this.

Supervisor Seifert advised that the Vallejo Veterans Center should be placed higher in the queue because of their efforts.

Mr. Artiche commented on the Facility Conditional Assessment and advised that the next CIP was anticipated to have updated information on this matter.

Supervisor Thomson commented on past and future improvement efforts for the Rio Vista Vets Memorial Building. He also commented on the Solano County Water Agency's efforts to look at how to reduce water usage. He then commented on recirculating pumps for hot water heaters and suggested that the Water Agency support those types of water conservation methods.

Chairwoman Hannigan invited members of the public to address the Board on this matter and the following comments were received:

A) George Guynn, Jr., Suisun City, commented on the CIP, County properties and water supply.

Supervisor Thomson commented on a recent newspaper article regarding the state of water infrastructure within California.

Ms. Corsello advised that the cities were looking at water loss and commented that much of the conversation seemed to be concentrated and focused on conservation efforts.

Chairwoman Hannigan closed the public hearing.

On motion of Supervisor Seifert, seconded by Supervisor Vasquez, the Board adopted the Updated Solano County 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan for Fiscal Years 2014-15 through 2018/19. So ordered by 5-0 vote.

Legislative, Intergovernmental and Public Affairs Officer Michelle Heppner introduced the item.

Vallejo Fire Chief Jack McArthur provided the Board with information on weed abatement efforts by the East Vallejo Fire Protection District.

Supervisor Seifert commented on concerns relating to drought and access for local fire station in the Homeacres and Glenn Cove areas. She then asked if the Glenn Cove station would be reopened.

Chief McArthur noted that stations 22 and 24 serviced the area.

In response to a question from Supervisor Seifert, Chief McArthur noted that the station in Glenn Cove was station 26 and that they were looking at opening it within the next year or so.

Supervisor Seifert asked what the estimated response time was currently for Station 22 to respond to the Glenn Cover area.

Chief McArthur noted that the response time was about 8 minutes, which was the allowable response time. He noted that the response time would be improved when the Glenn Cove station opened.

Supervisor Seifert asked about the weed abatement notice to comply of 48 hours and what the repercussions were if that time was not met.

Chief McArthur noted that residents were notified in October 2014 about the weed abatement needs and provided information about different requirements for weed abatement. He advised that the district would work with residents that contacted them about abatement. He also advised that the district could begin contracting out the weed abatement after the 48 hours timeframe had expired without contact from the resident.

Supervisor Seifert commented on the importance and need to stay on top of the weed abatement.

Chief McArthur commented that the public could call his office for any concerns or information.

On motion of Supervisor Spering, seconded by Supervisor Vasquez, the Board approved an Appropriation Transfer Request (ATR) to recognize \$40,000 in unanticipated property tax revenue for fire protection services. So ordered by 5-0 vote.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS AND REPORTS ON MEETINGS

Chairwoman Hannigan invited members of the Board to make comments or reports on meetings. The following comments were received:
